a message from Gary De Carolis




Our Board of Directors recently had its yearly retreat. It was an opportunity to look back on the past year, assess where we are today, and plan for the upcoming year. We were appreciative of Meg Fuerst, Action Circles, for facilitating the meeting. There were many positives this past year, and some of them were on display at the recently held Recovery is the Answer! Peer Support is the way! Conference and the Recovery Stars Benefit Dinner & Silent Auction. Tracie Hauck, Executive Director, Turning Point Center of Rutland, received the Mark Helijas Recovery Pioneer Award for her amazing work in the correctional system providing recovery coaching in the Marble Valley Correctional Center and post release. It has made a profound difference for many men, both currently and previously incarcerated. Also, we presented the 2023 Recovery Stars Awards to Representative Dane Whitman and Senator Richard Westman who helped move the recovery work in this state forward by great strides. These two legislative giants marshaled a financial package in their respective legislative chambers that, for the first time in the history of Vermont's recovery centers, allows them to have medical, dental, and eye care insurance while moving all employees of the centers towards receiving competitive wages. The total package amounted to \$2.6 million.

There was one more thing that stood out in my mind from the retreat. There was a desire across the board members for more human contact!!! I'm sure the conference and dinner helped with this, but it reminded me of the thousands of Vermonters who have an alcohol and/or substance use addiction, whether they are in recovery or still actively using, who rely on social connection and community. We need to do more this year to restore that sense of community. To make sure there is a hand reaching out to those that need someone who cares and does not judge. We all need that sense of community. It is the one thing we can do that very likely in the end has the most powerful impact on the world of addiction and recovery. Let's do it! Thank you.

Recovery Coaching Ethics

This training satisfies the IC&RC Certified Recovery Coach 6 CEU Ethics renewal requirement and covers the following domains:

- Recognize risk indicators that may affect the individual's welfare and safety.
- Respond to personal risk indicators to assure welfare and safety.
- Communicate to support network personal issues that impact ability to perform job duties.
- Report suspicions of abuse or neglect to appropriate authority.
- Evaluate the individual's satisfaction with their progress toward recovery/wellness goals.
- Maintain documentation and collect data as required.
- Adhere to responsibilities and limits of the role.
- Apply fundamentals of cultural competency.
- Recognize and adhere to the rules of confidentiality.
- Recognize and maintain professional and personal boundaries.
- Recognize and address personal and institutional biases and behaviors.
- Maintain current, accurate knowledge of trends and issues related to wellness and recovery.
- Recognize various crisis and emergency situations.
- Use organizational/departmental chain of command to address or resolve issues.
- Practice non-judgmental behavior.



WOUND CARE SUPPLIES



SELF-CARE STEPS

- Clean hands with soap & water or hand sanitizer before touching wounds
- Gently wash wound with soap & water or with saline at least every 2-3 days
- Put ointment on gauze & place on entire wound. Cover with more dry gauze
- Wrap wound with kerlix and secure with medical tape. Make sure wrap is not too tight
- Cover dressing with ACE wrap or coban or with long sleeves/pants if no other option
- 6 Change dressing every 1-3 days. Watch for red flags

XYLAZINE

// zai · luh · zeen //

AKA "Trang" or "Trang Dope"

A cutting agent making its way into the drug supply. Contamination with xylazine increases risk of sedation, overdose, and wounds that are hard to heal.



A few key takeaways from the Monthly Opioid Morbidity and Mortality Report:

Xylazine Involvement in Opioid Overdose Fatalities

• Through July 2023, Vermont reported 45 opioid overdose fatalities involving Xylazine (32.1%).

Cocaine

• Through July 2023, 86 opioid related overdose fatalities involved cocaine (61.4%)

Methamphetamine

• Through July 2023, 4 opioid related overdose fatalities involved methamphetamines (2.8%).

• Gabapentin

• Through July 2023, 15 opioid related overdose fatalities involved gabapentin (10.7%)

The Overdose Response Strategy (ORS) program is an unprecedented public health-public safety partnership between the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) through their support of the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) program and the CDC Foundation. At its core, the ORS is an example of a cross-agency, interdisciplinary collaboration with a single mission of reducing drug overdose deaths and saving lives.
